Preserving New Members with Discipleship, Part 2



How can local churches better serve new members?

Every local church should have a **Systematic Discipleship Ministry***:

1. Choose a _____ who will be responsible for the ministry such as a discipleship ministry leader or a personal ministries leader or assistant.
2. Recruit experienced members who will serve as _____ to the newly baptized members. Every new member should be paired with one of these mentors.
3. Provide practical instruction on the _____ of the Christian life—spiritual habits such as daily prayer and Bible study, consistent attendance, regular witnessing, and church ministry involvement.
4. Provide _____ instruction in areas such as Bible doctrines, church life, Christian lifestyle, and evangelism.
5. _____ new members into the church by helping them to meet other members, get involved in church ministries, experience worship and fellowship with different families in the church, etc..
